LARIMER COUNTY BAR ASSOCIATION FALL TERM DAY MINUTES FROM THE SEPTEMBER 11, 2020

- 1. CALL TO ORDER & INTRODUCTION: Bar President Arthur Spicciati called the meeting to order at 9:09 a.m. Mr. Spicciati introduced the Executive Committee and Judges present. He thanked Kristin Sheeran for setting up the hybrid meeting arrangements made necessary by the pandemic.
- 2. STATE OF THE JUDICIARY – Chief Judge Stephen Howard began by recognizing that the last term day was on the very beginning of the covid pandemic and adjustments have lasted longer than public health experts predicted. The courthouse closed shortly after the pandemic started, but has been gradually reopening on a somewhat limited basis. Staff are working from home at least part time. Courts converted fairly quickly to video for many proceedings. Judge Howard recognized Judges Lynch and Lammons for their expertise in technical aspects, and administrative staff for efforts on technology and people (jury), and health assessments. The first jury trials started again in early August, with limitations on the number of jury trials that can be conducted. Accommodations include the distances between people and the number of prospective juries needed for felony trials, using only A courtrooms for jury trials due to space, and can only start one jury trial per day. This means that civil trials are at the bottom of the priority list. Litigants are strongly urged to consider bench trials. While the courts are continuing to do many proceedings remotely it is up to the individual judge's discretion regarding reasonable feasibility. The pandemic has had drastically reduced the state's revenues, so the budget for the coming year will be reduced drastically. The majority of budget is staff/personnel. To address the estimated 5% cut, the Courts did not backfill positions. So far it appears that the staff is keeping up well with filings. Effective July 1st, criminal case defendants can opt into a court-provided text reminder service of scheduled dates. The county ceased providing telephone calls with the text messages. The process is up and running, but may not be as effective as voice reminders. Judge Howard reminded the Bar that attorneys should have received email regarding magistrate evaluations and requested responses. The evaluations have been simplified to essentially one question. Magistrate Spengler will retire at the end of the month and interviews were conducted the same day as term day. The magistrate rotation will on who is hired to the new magistrate bench. Tentatively, Magistrate Linda Connors will move to DNN, Magistrate Kandace Majoros to post-decree, then the new in Magistrate will be in courtroom 1A. Judge Howard will retire in January.
- 3. **COURT RESOURCE CENTER** Ian Bonner reported covid has changed the resource center operations. After closing in March, the Resource Center established an email inbox for pro se filings. Resource Center has helped about 15 people a day in person and 80+ per day with emails / phone / in person counted. Will be restarting ask a lawyer clinics by phone, scheduled for the second Tuesday of each month. Requested volunteers for all virtual classes and ask a lawyer sessions.

- 4. **CLE PROGRAM** Renee Doak Looking into getting a zoom subscription to allow committees and organizations to present CLE programs via zoom. Juvenile Recovery Court CLE being planned with Magistrate Zehe. Larimer Women's Bar also working on fun and fascinating CLE. All planned CLE will be announced through the Messenger and blast announcements. Ms. Doak also solicited ideas for CLE.
- 5. **TREASURER'S REPORT** Treasurer Rebekah Berry-Chaney reported that the annual budget meeting included conservative planning. Dues income has been above the budgeted level, which helps support social, pro bono, young lawyers, and Access to Justice programs. Financials are posted on the website.
- 6. ACCESS TO JUSTICE Brooke Alexander reported that the Access to Justice Committee is working at the state and local level to address a widening chasm in access. She discussed ways to get involved, including Ask a Lawyer day events on November 6. All programs for November 6 will be online (telephone / zoom). Volunteering for as little as 30 minutes is useful. Please sign up with Rebekah Berry-Chaney, Brooke Alexander or Ian Bonner. The next committee meeting is at noon on October 15; email Brooke to get zoom link. Also need attorneys for the modest means list (discount consults, unbundled, reduced rates).
- 7. **PROFESSIONALISM COMMITTEE** Mr. Spicciati read an emailed report from Jennifer Rice. There is no current plan to reschedule the spring ethics seminar that was cancelled due to covid restrictions. The committee is working on ways to present an ethics CLE program in the future.
- 8. **BOARD OF GOVERNORS -** No report.
- 9. **PRO BONO PROGRAM** Ben Kramer and Cody Knebel reported the Pro Bono program has gone digital like most other programs. Applications are available on the LCBA Website and Cindy Hendrix is screening applicants. Attorney participation is currently very low and we are asking that you reach out to Cindy or Ben Kramer (bkramer@gjmlawfirm.com) if you are willing to consider taking cases. It is a great way for young lawyers to get involved and gain experience. Many questions can be answered with one consult. Thank you to all LCBA members for your support of the Pro Bono Program!
- 10. **Women's Bar** Claire Havelda introduced the Women's Bar Board, including Callen Reidel, Bronwyn Scurlock, and Rene Doak. The Women's Bar is planning to use zoom for discussions and CLE. Anyone supporting the mission of the Women's Bar is welcome to join. October 23rd will be a zoom lunch discussing the Senate Bill 2017 regarding law enforcement integrity. November 13th will be a case law update with Sara Steiben and Rachel Michael. Spring CLE will include "Removing Closet Doors: Cultivating LGBTQ Inclusivity," CLE on human trafficking, and a book discussion on how to be an antiracist.
- 11. **NATIONAL ADOPTION DAY** Heidi Whitaker reported that with most proceedings being done virtually and covid restrictions, there will not be an in person celebration. The Bar intends to put together boxes for celebrating families.
- 12. YOUNG LAWYERS DIVISION Fred Long reported that networking events have fallen off due to covid. Young Lawyers will be starting coffee program for law students, recent law grads, and those seeking work. Please contact Fred (or any officers of YLD) to set up a coffee meeting (real or virtual) fredl@li-law.com. YLD is working to co-sponsor events coming up with LCWBA.
- 13. **FAMILY LAW BEST PRACTICES** Judge Field sent a report that significant changes in last few months include domestic relations cases now being sent to district courts sooner for trial settings and pre trial conferences. The Best Practices Committee is working to simplify local forms and stream line information for new cases. There is a statewide effort to simplify undisputed cases. Work is in progress on

a pilot project for focused assessments in child issues. Hearings and trials during covid have been both in person and webex. The Committee also developed a training proposal for new judges and magistrates. Hope to resume brown bags in the fall. Please let Judge Field or Magistrate Connors know if identify issues related to family law.

- 14. **MOCK TRIAL** Magistrate Connors was in court. No report at this time. Ian McCargar reported that the state level is expecting to conduct the program virtually.
- 15. **MENTORSHIP PROGRAM AND LIBRARY** Ian McCargar stated he is grateful and fortunate to be together even by video. Mentorship program is still available. Anyone wanting either formal or informal mentorship or to volunteer to be either a formal or informal mentor, please contact Ian. The library committee is not currently meeting. The Roy Scholarship Program is normally funded from the spring Ethics Seminar. With the seminar cancelled due to covid, please consider donating to Steve Roy Scholarship through the community foundation of Northern Colorado. Dan St John is working with the task force for Greater Colorado through the State Bar. The task force mission is to improve the relevance of state bar association membership for those members outside the Denver metro area, provide a greater effort for diversity equity and inclusiveness. - 16. **INTRODUCTION OF NEW LAWYERS** Sara Stieben introduced James Bush, Dan Sapienza, Ingrid Decker, Adam Stevens, Tom Joaquim, and Suzanne Ewy.
